Christianity, Sovereignty and Universalism in International Relations

Cecilia Lynch is professor for political science at University of California, Irvine and director of the Center for Global Peace and Conflict Studies. She holds a PhD in political science from Columbia University (1993). She works on religion and ethics in international affairs, social movements and civil society organizations, and interpretive/qualitative methods in social science research. She is currently completing a book on tensions in Christian ethics over the use of violence in the twentieth-century, and is researching another, "Islamic and Interfaith Religious Ethics in World Crises" on interfaith, Christian, and Islamic humanitarianism. Her articles address how we analyze religion in world politics, Islamic NGOs in Kenya, Christian diplomacy, the role of social movements and civil society actors on peace, globalization, humanitarianism, and religious/secular ethics, the relationship between contemporary theological constructs and international relations, constructivist ethics in international politics, substantive issues in qualitative and interpretive research methods, and the use of E.H. Carr and Immanuel Kant in international relations theory.
