Regulations for Recognizing Other Academic Achievements in Accordance with Section 7 of the Academic Regulations for the Doctoral Degree Program in Business, Economics and Social Sciences

At its meeting on 10 May 2017, the doctoral committee of the Faculty of Business, Economics and Social Sciences agreed the following regulations for recognizing other academic achievements in accordance with Section 7 of the academic regulations for the doctoral degree program in business, economics, and social sciences:

The following types of participation can be credited towards the total 12 ECTS credits:

- courses offered by the graduate school of the Faculty of Business, Economics and Social Sciences;
- modules from the master's programs offered by the Faculty of Business, Economics and Social Sciences;
- courses at other graduate schools;
- research workshops, summer schools, etc.;
- lectures at conferences (max. 2 ECTS credits);
- courses/events organized independently by doctoral researchers when these have been deemed eligible by the Faculty Doctoral Committee;
- teaching activities, including practical courses. For each course taught, doctoral researchers receive the same number of ECTS credits as the students taking the course. No more than 6 ECTS credits may be awarded for teaching activities. If a course is taught repeatedly, ECTS credits may only be awarded once;
- continuing education in higher education (e.g., courses taken at the Hamburg Center for University Teaching and Learning (HUL)) (max. 2 ECTS credits);
- other equivalent forms of academic performance and continuing education that must be approved by the Doctoral Committee.

These regulations apply to all doctoral researchers who submit their doctoral dissertation to the Faculty Doctoral Committee after 1 April 2018. Annex A of the doctoral degree regulations dated 24 August 2010 applies to doctoral researchers who submit their doctoral dissertation by 1 April 2018.
