Seminar/Institute Junior Professorship in Macroeconomics

Universität Hamburg invites applications for a **Research Associate** for the project "Shining (New) Light on Regional Inequality, Convergence and Development" in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg Higher Education Act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG). The position commences on 1 September 2017.

It is remunerated at the salary level TV-L 13 and calls for 75 % of standard work hours per week*.

The fixed-term nature of this contract is based upon Section 2 of the Academic Fixed-Term Labor Contract Act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The initial fixed term is **three years**.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg Equality Act (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).

Responsibilities:

Duties include academic services in the project named above. The associate will have the opportunity to pursue further academic qualifications, in particular a doctoral dissertation. At least one-third of set working hours will be made available for the associate's own academic work.

Specific Duties:

The project named above involves the development and application of econometric methods with the goal of investigating regional inequality, convergence and development around the world. The research associate will be working with satellite data of nighttime luminosity and other geo-referenced data, which (s)he will be analyzing with the help of statistical software packages.

Requirements:

You have a good or very good master's degree in economics, statistics or a related quantitative discipline. With your strong background knowledge in econometrics and statistics, you have already gained some experience working with empirical data. You like programming and you are willing to learn to how to use new software programmes. You enjoy doing research, learning new things and working in a team.
