## ACTING PROFESSORSHIP FOR ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS (W3)

The position commences on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2020. This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with the German part-time and fixed-term contract act (Gesetz über Teilzeitarbeit und befristete Arbeitsverträge, TzBfG). The contract period is for a period of one semester. The position calls for 100% of standard work hours per week.\*

## **SPECIFIC DUTIES:**

The successful candidate is expected to teach and conduct research in the field named above. Applicants should have an expertise in the area of environmental and climate economics. Interdisciplinary experience and interests are welcome. Cooperation with researchers within the Department of Socioeconomics and the Cluster of Excellence "Climate, Climate Change and Society" are encouraged. Applicants are expected to have published in high-ranking, international, peer-reviewed journals.

The teaching load are up to nine units of 45min each per week over a 14 week teaching period. The successful candidate is expected to teach courses in microeconomics and environmental and climate economics within the undergraduate and graduate programmes of the department. The ability to teach in German and English is a plus.

## **REQUIREMENTS:**

Academic qualifications and additional requirements as specified in Section 15 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) apply.

## **ADDITIONAL CRITERIA:**

The successful applicant is expected to have international research experience. The University places particular emphasis on the quality of teaching and therefore requests applicants to provide details of their teaching experience and objectives.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages qualified women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg act on gender equality (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
