The position in accordance with Section 28 subsection 1 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) commences on September 1, 2019 or as soon as possible .

This is a fixed term contract in accordance with Section 2 of the academic fixed-term labor contract act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The initial fixed term is three years. The position calls for 75% of standard work hours per week.*

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Research associates will be expected primarily to teach and conduct research. The research associate will also have the opportunity to pursue further academic qualifications, in particular a doctoral dissertation. At least one-third of set working hours will be made available for the research associate's own academic work.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

Research of the group is in the field of public economics, combining theory, behavioral economics, and experiments. A particular focus is on environmental economic questions, for example within the Excellence Cluster Climate, Climatic Change, and Society, (CLiCCS). Besides an active role in research projects, the position involves 3 hours per week teaching of tutorials and the supervision of students in seminars, e.g. in Microeconomics, Public Economics, Environmental and Resource Economics. The candidate will be a member in a team with a strong research focus in an international network and is offered intensive support of the dissertation project. An excellent command of English is required.

REQUIREMENTS:

A university degree in a relevant field. Required is a master degree in Economics, Mathematical Economics or in a related discipline. Profound knowledge of microeconomic theory and its applications is essential.

* Full-time positions currently comprise 39 hours per week.

The University aims to increase the number of women in research and teaching and explicitly encourages women to apply. Equally qualified female applicants will receive preference in accordance with the Hamburg act on gender equality (Hamburgisches Gleichstellungsgesetz, HmbGleiG).

Qualified disabled candidates or applicants with equivalent status receive preference in the application process.
