The research assistant will support research projects on the economics of sustainability, including applications to climate change, air pollution, and biodiversity conservation. In most of these projects, we combine local environmental observations with socio-economic data and economic outcomes. You will support us in these projects primarily with cleaning, preparing, and pre-analysing data sets. Further tasks can include, for instance, also literature reviews.

The ideal candidate should have:

- very good academic performance
- very good knowledge of English
- good knowledge of Stata or R
- interest in programming languages (such as LaTeX, Phython or JavaScript)
- strong work ethics, good organizational skills, and the ability to work independently
- interest in empirical research as well as in environmental economics and policy

Working time will be 20-30 hours per month with a current gross hourly wage of € 12.68. The contract will initially be a fixed term appointment for six months, and can be extended thereafter. We offer a nice, dynamic working environment, flexibility in allocating working hours and insights into the research and teaching activities of our working group.
