Registration	<p>Please register on the website of the International Office. You will receive the instructions during Study Orientation Session. Please sent me your final Learning Agreement by mail for signature and stamp.</p> <p>! Registration is binding - there is no late registration, or late withdrawal past this period. With the registration for a course you are automatically registered for the exam as well.</p>
Program	<p>The program offers both, lectures with integrated tutorials and lectures without tutorials (see course overview in print and online (in STiNE)). For lectures with integrated tutorials, it is mandatory to register for one tutorial in order to be admitted to the exam.</p> <p>During the course, students might be required to contribute to the class (“Studienleistungen”) by writing short essays, solving problem sets, giving presentations etc. These contributions might be graded and can be announced as a prerequisite for admission to the final course exam.</p> <p>Due to the Corona situation, a lot of classes and tutorials are taught online. You can find this information in the STiNE course catalogue.</p>
Language of instruction	<p>German and some tutorial in English</p>
Courses and assessments outside the program	<p>Permit by the coordinator is necessary and need to be arranged individually by you. Make sure you obtain a certificate of successful completion of the respective examination (“Leistungsschein”).</p>
Types of assessment	<p>Normally, lectures finish with a written exam at the end of the course. A written exam requires the student to fulfill a predefined task under supervision by a proctor, independently and using permissible materials only. It generally lasts a minimum of 45 and a maximum of 180 minutes. They may also be given in the form of a multiple-choice test. Exams for the B.Sc. VWL will take place during the regular examination periods (see below). In some cases, the lecture might offer an oral exam (i.e. to compensate for missed examination dates due to illness). An oral exam is a discussion in which the student demonstrates that he or she masters the exam material. They may be given individually or in groups and should last at least 15 and no more than 45 minutes. Please note that oral exams must be permitted by the respective program director first (not by the lecturer). If you wish to take an oral exam, you must consult the departmental coordinator first!</p> <p>Due to the Corona situation, there could be some changes at short notice. You will be informed as soon as possible by the academic office or by the lecturer.</p>
